Assisting Low-Income Youth

The purpose of youth services in Oswego County is to provide information to eligible youth on the array of services available through the One-Stop Center and the local community, to provide appropriate referrals and services to meet their needs, and to enable them to achieve academic and employment success.

Each youth will participate in an objective assessment to examine academic and occupational skill levels and individual service needs. An individual service plan that identifies a career goal incorporating the assessment results will be completed for each youth.

Overarching Goals:

- Ensure high school completion and graduation
- Return to school to obtain GED for those who have dropped out
- Obtain employment
- Encourage post-secondary education (college or vocational training)

Program Description:

Services are designed to help low-income youth ages 16-21:

- Improve education and skill competencies
- Develop education and employment goals
- Make the connection between school and work
- Provide effective links to the labor market

Eligibility:

- 16-21 years old
- US Citizen or legally authorized to work in the United States
- Low income based on federal guidelines
- Possess one or more barriers to employment
